In June 2013, Gladys Berejiklian said: "Can I assure you that the Wollongong service will continue forever more."



Recently, the Berejiklian Liberal Government lobbed a surprise announcement on Wollongong – from 29 January 2018, the Free Gong Shuttle will

no longer be free.

Despite strong community anger, the Premier said in Question Time on 14 November 2017:

#### "The Illawarra has never had it so good."

The Free Gong Shuttle is a crucial part of Wollongong's public transport infrastructure.

It provides much needed transport services for students, pensioners, carers and other commuters for access to Wollongong Hospital, the University of Wollongong, Wollongong TAFE and the Wollongong CBD.

It reduces traffic congestion on our local roads.

#### No-one supports this decision by the Government.

My Parliamentary colleague, Member for Keira, Ryan Park MP, and I have launched a petition to **keep the Gong Shuttle Free.**

## THE FACTS

- ► The Gong Shuttle was introduced in March 2009 by the former Labor Government.
- ► Commuters can use it for free.
- ► The Free Gong Shuttle service links Wollongong Hospital, the University of Wollongong, TAFE and Wollongong CBD.
- It reduces congestion on our local roads.
- ▶ 3.3 million passengers use it every year.
- ► The Berejikilian Government announced recently that from 29 January 2018, using the Gong Shuttle would attract Opal Card fares.
- No-one in Wollongong supports the Berejiklian Government's decision.
- Wollongong City Council, the University of Wollongong, Illawarra Business Chamber, South Coast Labour Council, and Transport Workers Union have all condemned this decision.

# Shellharbour & Port Kembla Hospitals to remain in public hands

Following nearly 13 months of strong community campaigning, the Berejiklian Government finally back flipped and announced that Shellharbour and Port Kembla Public Hospitals will remain publicly-owned and run hospitals.



The Government had proposed making Shellharbour Public Hospital part of a publicprivate partnership (PPP) in a surprise announcement last year. This decision would also directly impact on services at Port Kembla Public Hospital.

It offered no further details on what health and hospital services would be available, except that a call for expressions of interest by for-profit health providers was under consideration. Those expressions of interest remain secret.

NSW Labor Leader, Luke Foley MP, made clear at a public rally of nearly 1000 Illawarra residents that Shellharbour Public Hospital should remain a publicly-owned and run hospital and called for the Berejikilian Government to abandon its plans to privatise our health and hospital system.

I was very concerned that had the Government gone ahead with its privatisation plans, there would be increased pressure on the Illawarra's main regional hospital in Wollongong.

NSW Labor will now hold the Berejiklian Government to account on a firm timetable for the \$251 million upgrade of Shellharbour Hospital, which it promised at the March 2015 election.



# Labor's Illawarra Jobs Action Plan

#### Wollongong and the Illawarra are a priority for NSW Labor.



We have already announced a suite of policies to invest in the region's road and rail transport infrastructure, create more jobs, and expand business

opportunities by linking up with Australia's third largest economy in south-west Sydney.

#### NSW LABOR'S POLICIES INCLUDE:

- Mandating the use of local, Australianmade steel in NSW Government infrastructure projects;
- ▶ \$50 million to upgrade the Appin Road;
- \$50 million in foundation capital and work with the private sector to progress construction of the Maldon-Dombarton rail link;
- ► \$50 million to upgrade the WIN Entertainment Centre;
- \$5 million to upgrade the Mt Keira Summit Park;
- ▶ \$40 million to build a new interchange at Springhill and Masters Roads;
- Relocating Liquor & Gaming NSW to Wollongong creating up to 200 new jobs;
- Re-establishing the Green Jobs initiative;



- ▶ \$5 million to build a Maker Space at the University of Wollongong's Innovation Campus; and
- ▶ \$25 million to upgrade the Unanderra Station, including installing its lifts.

NSW Labor's policy also includes restoring the Minister for the Illawarra position to NSW

Cabinet, as well as, an annual State of the Region Address and a Cabinet meeting held in the Illawarra.
