# DELIVERING FOR PORT KEMBLA

Eleven local projects are sharing in over \$1 million.



**1 Port Kembla Cricket Association Inc. \$73,276**

King George V Park Sporting Infrastructure: Replacing the cricket pitch and safety netting on Oval #1.

**4 Dalfram Dispute Memorial \$108,000**

Designing and constructing a memorial that commemorates the Dalfram Dispute on 15 November 1938. Memorial to be located in the Port Kembla Heritage Park precinct.

**9 Port Kembla Wetlands Rehabilitation \$31,100**

Stage One activities include the rehabilitation of the Port Kembla Heritage Park pond and engagement of community volunteers in Green and Gold Bell Frog monitoring surveys across Port Kembla.

**5 St Patrick's Parish Hall \$134,278**

Hall for parish, school, and community use including a new roof, new external wall cladding, strengthened floor supports, upgraded kitchen, and some minor works.

**10 Employment land activation \$100,000**

Activities include studies, investigations, infrastructure planning and legislative amendments to address key constraints preventing the release of surplus industrial land in Port Kembla for alternative employment-generating uses.

**6 Improving disabled access \$100,760**

At Anglican Church Parish of Port Kembla that links the Church and Hall with the car park. Stage 1 (design) of this project has already received funding.

**11 Environment Protection Authority \$44,000**

Preparing a report on the presence of lead and other heavy metals in air, soil and roof dust from legacy industrial activities in Port Kembla. The report will include measures to manage human health risks from these contaminants.

**2 Port Kembla Breakwater Battery Museum \$79,500**

Restoring and preserving the Breakwater Battery Military Museum including painting the outside of the Museum building, installing two large signs on the Museum, and restoring a WW1 Artillery Gun for display in Heritage Park.

**7 King George V Park Oval lighting \$321,500**

Oval #2 improvements including installing a lighting system on six 24.3 metre light towers.

**3 Wonderwalls Port Kembla \$109,482**

Installing 10 medium to large-scale wall murals by acclaimed artists on Port Kembla buildings within the Wentworth Street town centre precinct.

**8 Tourism Development Plan \$32,000**

Producing a Tourism Development Plan for Port Kembla that will assess public and private land for new or enhanced tourism attractions.
